

## CCS LATIN STUDENTS EARN GOLD, SILVER ON THE 2021 NATIONAL LATIN AND NATIONAL MYTHOLOGY EXAMS

For more than two decades CCS Latin students have earned awards on the **National Latin Exam**, which was taken by students in the U.S. and abroad. This year the National Latin Exam was offered to students ranging from Latin I to AP Latin.

In addition, for the eighth consecutive year CCS students participated in the the **National Mythology Exam**.

Given the difficulties of the past year, far fewer students than usual opted to take these exams, but nonetheless several hearty scholars persevered and earned awards.

### NATIONAL LATIN EXAM

This year's silver medalists are Georgia McEntee (L I) and Kobe McManus (L III).

Also, Johanna Lynip (L III) earned a *Magna Cum Laude* award.

### NATIONAL MYTHOLOGY EXAM

The 2021 Pegasus Mythology Exam, offered to 8th graders, includes questions on general classical mythology as well as Homer's *Odyssey* (Book XXIII).

Georgia McEntee earned a silver medal, Joseph Maher took home a *Magna Cum Laude*, and Marguerite Steele won *Cum Laude* recognition.

The theme of the 2021 Medusa Mythology Exam, offered to 9th-12th grade students, was "Monstrous Mutations."

The solo gold medalist this year is Madeline Flint (Adv. Latin Poetry).

Silver medals were earned by Isabelle Flint (L II) and Johanna Lynip (L III).

The following earned *Magna Cum Laude* awards: Orion Baker Porazinski (Adv. Latin Poetry), Fiona Mooney (AP), Jackson Thomas (L II), Carter Wilkins (Adv. Latin Poetry), and Isaac Wilkins (L III); while Andrew Berthiaume (L III) and Chaylyn Harrington (L II) received *Cum Laude* certificates.
